**Background:** The National Congress of American Indians (NCAI) established a National Native Youth Training Collaborative to strengthen the visibility of American Indian and Alaska Native youth in policy and research contexts and to highlight the value of Native cultures. With funding from the Administration for Native Americans, NCAI aims to: I) Increase the number of American Indian and Alaska Native youth prepared with foundations, political knowledge, and skills to become national and tribal leaders through the National Native Youth Cabinet (NNYC); 2) Identify strategies for improving policy and data on issues of significance to American Indian and Alaska Native youth; and 3) Host a Virtual Challenge competition to imagine community innovations and change.

**Purpose:** Share information with NNYC members about national data of significance to their priorities and generate input from Cabinet members about national data development.
