RESOLUTION #SD-02-082

Title: To Request Veterans Administration to Work with NCAI Veterans Committee to Provide Training, Technical Support and Financial Assistance

WHEREAS, we, the members of the National Congress of American Indians of the United States, invoking the divine blessing of the Creator upon our efforts and purposes, in order to preserve for ourselves and our descendants the inherent sovereign rights of our Indian nations, rights secured under Indian treaties and agreements with the United States, and all other rights and benefits to which we are entitled under the laws and Constitution of the United States, to enlighten the public toward a better understanding of the Indian people and their way of life, to preserve Indian cultural values, and otherwise promote the health, safety and welfare of the Indian people, do hereby establish and submit the following resolution; and

WHEREAS, the National Congress of American Indians (NCAI) was established in 1944 and is the oldest and largest national organization of American Indian and Alaska Native tribal governments; and

WHEREAS, the United States has a unique legal relationship with Indian tribal governments as set forth in the Constitution of the United States, treaties, statutes, executive orders, and court decisions; and

WHEREAS, Executive Order No. 13175 on Consultation and Coordination With Indian Tribal Governments requires Federal agencies to consult with Indian Tribes in their development of regulations and policies that have Federalism or tribal implications; and

WHEREAS, the Veterans Administration mission is "[t]o serve America's veterans and their families with dignity and compassion and be their principal advocate in ensuring that they receive medical care, benefits, social support, and lasting memorials..."; and

WHEREAS, American Indians served in the Armed Forces in greater proportions than any other racial entity; and

WHEREAS, American Indian veterans are significantly underrepresented when it comes to applying for and receiving federal compensation and benefits; and

WHEREAS, programs are needed to assist veteran service officers and the Veterans Administration in contacting American Indian veterans, educating them on federal compensation and benefits that are available, and assisting those veterans in applying for compensation and benefits; and

WHEREAS, it is estimated that less than five percent of federally recognized Indian tribes have employed Tribal Veteran Representatives resulting in a loss of entitled benefits for veterans, spouses, dependents, and survivors; and

WHEREAS, training, technical support, and financial assistance is needed to sustain veterans departments by all Tribal Nations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the NCAI does hereby support this resolution and request the Veterans Administration to work with NCAI's Veterans Committee to provide training, technical support, and financial assistance so that American Indians may have greater access to compensation and benefits and other services; and

BE IT FINALLY RESOLVED, that this resolution shall be the policy of the NCAI until it is withdrawn or modified by subsequent resolution.

CERTIFICATION

The foregoing resolution was adopted at the 2002 Annual Session of the National Congress of American Indians, held at the Town and Country Convention Center, in San Diego, California on November 10-15, 2002 with a quorum present.
