Mode of Instruction Status

- ✓ Most schools are in-person
- ✓ TCS Schools
 - 82 in-person - 37 of these offer remote
 - 10 schools in remote/hybrid
 - 7 schools in hybrid
- ✓ BOS Schools
 - Combination of in-person/remote/hybrid
- ✓ ORBs welcomed back students last month

- LMS budget support included in FY 2022 Request

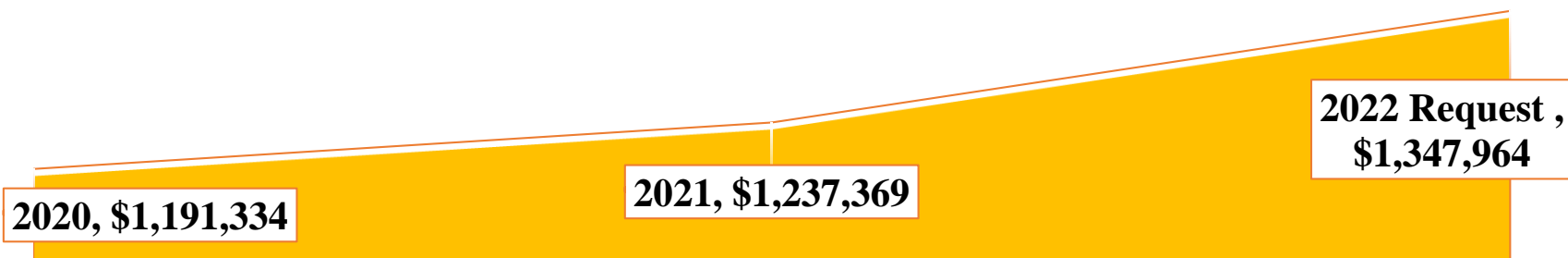


Assessment Updates

 - ASIA approved blanket waiver of SY 21/22 instructional hours, bus and commercial transportation, and residential counts.
 - Propose extension of this blanket waiver for SY 22/23
 - Funding would continue to be allocated based on pre-pandemic student counts certified by school leaders.
