The goal is to identify a set of actionable recommendations for improvements.</p> <p><u>Actions items from call (for NCAI/Tribal Reps):</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Look at the cross cut and make a list of additional information needed. A draft template will be shared at the TIBC meeting in Montana for review by the tribal reps.</li> <li>• Compile a short list of top 5-10 known reasons why tribes have challenges accessing federal funding across programs and a list of recommended actions agencies and the executive could take to address these challenges.</li> <li>• A list of the most highly accessed/important programs tribes depend on for “base funding” (formula based programs)</li> <li>• A list of the number of tribes accessing the programs/funding opportunities.</li> <li>• A list of the programs that tribes must compete with other entities, i.e. states, local gov’ts, etc.</li> </ul>
