

INVESTIGATING NON-INDIAN DOMESTIC VIOLENCE AGAINST AN INDIAN

- 1. Don't worry about jurisdiction. It gets complicated. The attorneys can figure that part out after you make the arrest and complete the investigative report.
- 2. Send reports to the Tribal Prosecutor, AUSA, and local FBI as soon as you safely can after the arrest.
- 3. Do thorough investigations the same as you would any other domestic violence crime.
- 4. Make certain your investigative report includes:
 - a. Where the suspect lives (on or off reservation);
 - b. Where the suspect is employed (on or off reservation);
 - c. The nature of the relationship between the suspect and victim;
 - d. If the victim is a member of the TRIBE;
 - e. If the victim is a member of another tribe (get evidence of this as best you can); and
 - Where the victim lives.
